11:00	<p>Site visit 1 – University Campus</p> <p>The University of Parma's Science and Technology Campus, known as Parco Area delle Scienze, spans 77 hectares of green space in the southern part of the city. The campus is undergoing sustainable transformations, including green walls, rainwater harvesting, renewable energy production, and smart technologies, aiming to become a Living Lab for environmental innovation.</p>

12:45	<p>Site visit 2 – MAS</p> <p>Mix House is an eco-sustainable building of approximately 1,300 square meters, comprising 60 housing units intended for segments of the population who may face challenges in accessing the conventional housing market. The units will serve as a testing ground for new forms of social housing, which are crucial for addressing housing exclusion, fostering social cohesion, and building more inclusive communities. The project, implemented by Parma Infrastrutture Spa, is part of the municipal program "Abitare la rigenerazione. MAS – Mosaico Abitativo Solidale", funded under PINQuA (“Innovative Program for Housing Quality”), which is included in Mission M5C2 Investment 2.3 of Italy’s National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR). The total investment amounts to over €16 million, with €15.5 million allocated specifically for the construction of the new building. The program focuses on urban regeneration and housing quality, the energy-efficient renovation of public buildings, and the development of new models of social housing.</p>
